Deputy Head Teacher Mr Pyburn said "It was like a mini Glastonbury".


"We are so proud of our incredibly talented students and the friendly atmosphere created by our community" agreed Head of the Creative Arts Faculty, Mrs Williams.



# Introduction of Microscale Chemistry experiments

The cost and safety of chemistry practical experiments sometimes result in teacher demonstrations rather than pupil practical's. CLEAPSS (the schools safety advisory body) has devised a series of small scale experiments that address these restrictions allowing pupils to experience, at first hand, the intricacies of chemical reactions.

After trialling some of these microscale experiments successfully the science teachers will be incorporating them into the curriculum, both at KS3 and KS4, next year.



# RAF visit Lakelands Academy as a Maths reward


Lakelands Academy had the pleasure of welcoming in the Royal Air Force on Friday 29th June 2018, organised by the Maths Faculty as a reward for attitude and effort in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subject lessons.

Year 9 and 10 students were nominated by Faculty staff from STEM subjects of Science, Graphic Products and Maths for their effort and attitude to learning within these subject lessons. The RAF hosted a number of STEM challenge activities including using giant Meccano like construction pieces, to create a transportation device to carry a given load and then for each team to race their creations around an obstacle course, some successfully and some less so.

"I really enjoyed this day. Some of the activities made us have to think outside of the box and cooperate with people we don't normally work with." Said Year 10 student Connor Bell.

Tom Clarke agreed "It was great to be able to do some maths in a hands on construction context rather than the theoretical maths we put into practice in the classroom.

"It was brilliant. It was good to work with people outside of our class groups and year groups and STEM is always fun."



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# Junior Maths Challenge and Kangaroo Success 2018

Lakelands Academy, Year 8 students have achieved 2 Gold awards and 3 Bronze in this year's UKMT Junior Maths Challenge.


The junior maths Challenge, aimed at those in years 7 and 8, is run by the UK Mathematics Trust and supported by the Institute and Faculty of Actuaries. Out of the 260,000 students from across the UK who sat the maths challenge, Charlie Jumar and Natasha Bryan Evans won the Gold level award out of the 6% total who achieved this level and Gabriella Winterbottom, Tom Staley and Amy Owen took Bronze, from the 21% nationwide, who achieved this level.

From his Gold level success, Charlie Jumar, one of the UKMT's top challenge students, was then invited to sit a follow on *Kangaroo* challenge, which he passed with flying colours.

Mrs Heath, Head of the Maths Faculty congratulated the students, "Once again we are really pleased that so many students did so well, particular congratulations to Charlie making it through to the national Kangaroo. We look forward to great things from the year 8s when they compete again in years 10 and 11 at the Intermediate challenge level."



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## VEX IQ Robotics competition

A massive well done goes to 6 of our talented students who competed at the Shropshire VEX IQ robotics competition at Severndale school on 11/07/18. The event was sponsored by the Royal Academy of Engineering who have donated £500 of robotics kits to schools to allow them to develop engineering and programming skills for small teams of pupils, with the aim for them to compete in the regional VEX IQ competition next year.

Our students competed in Robot football, a drag race and a programming challenge around a maze. They then presented their journey to the other groups.

The group won the most imaginative robot design.

I'm really pleased for Kieran. I didn't think he'd get there this year but there is still time and it puts a bit more pressure on me to get qualified myself."

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## Lakelands Students Sporting Success at Shropshire Schools County Athletics

Louis Schofield leapt to success, achieving Gold medal wins in both the Long Jump and High Jump at the Shropshire Schools County Athletics competition on 9<sup>th</sup> June, gaining him automatic entry in the Mason Trophy later this month.

Year 10 students Louis Schofield and Katie Othen representing Lakelands Academy, are both celebrating personal triumphs at the competition as well as medal wins.

Year 10 student Louis, up against 9 other competitors, leapt to the Gold medal positions in the U17s Boys intermediate High Jump at a personal best height of 1.7m and then again in the Long Jump at a winning distance of 6.1m.

“The high jump competition was really close and very hard and I really had to go for it” Louis professed. “I really enjoyed competing against such high standard and really having to push myself and I was really, really happy to have beaten my own personal best.”

These wins gain him entry into the Mason Trophy Inter County competition on 16<sup>th</sup> June at the Alexander Stadium in Birmingham.

“I’m nervous but really looking forward to this next competition. It will be the biggest competition I’ve ever been entered for.”

Katie competed in the long jump and also smashed her own personal best times twice, in the U17s Girls intermediate 200m event.

“I was really happy to beat my personal best times, it shows I’m still improving” expressed Katie. “My next competition will be in August where I will be representing the Oswestry Olympians again in the 200m and Long Jump and with the time I have to train between now and then, I’m hopeful that I will have improved even more in both events.”



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## Lakelands Student Swims To Success at Shropshire Schools Swimming Championships



Lakelands Academy student, Phoebe Townsend has achieved Gold, winning both the 100m Backstroke and Freestyle events in the intermediate category, at the Shropshire Schools Swimming Championships held in May.

Phoebe, who regularly swims for the Oswestry Otters, was entered into the championship tournament by PE Teacher Mr Warder after beating the entry requirement time, to swim representing Lakelands academy.

“I love to compete and this was a really good competition where I really had to strive hard to win but also beat my own personal best time.” Year 10 Lakelands Academy student Phoebe expressed. “The crowd was really enthusiastic and very supportive and this always seems to make me perform better.”

Phoebe is now aiming to next compete for the Oswestry Otters at the Welsh Nationals held in Swansea in August. “This will be a bigger and even greater experience and hopefully an even better atmosphere. I will also be able to enter a greater number of events, so I’m really training hard to get to this.”

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# Lakelands Academy Duke of Edinburgh take on the challenging weather

Lakelands Academy Year 9 & 10, Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, Expedition participants, although enjoying the sunny weather have also had to brave and contend with a whole host of extra challenges this year that have arisen from this year's fantastic weather and the very unpredictable conditions resulting from it.

Any Student, embarking upon their DofE Expeditions will know that being prepared for whatever the weather throws at you, plays a huge role in the attainment of this section and more often than not rain and mud are very much the expected norm. However, this year the students have embarked upon their journeys and taken up the extra challenges faced with flash floods, thunder and lightning as well as the sweltering hot weather currently being enjoyed across Britain.

The initial Bronze hiking expedition started with beautiful weather but that first evening brought on a spectacular light show, of lightning and torrential downpours over the Stiperstones, bringing the expedition to a very washed out early finish.

Silver participant, Year 10 student Annabelle Forse agreed "We don't want to wish the sunny days away but it is definitely better to carry a backpack in cooler weather."

Year 10 students are now preparing for their qualifying Silver expedition in July.

"I think we all hope it stays dry. This hot weather has been amazing and it would be great for the camping side of it but it would be nice to have it a bit cooler for cycling in." said Silver participant, Year 10 Madeleine Porritt.

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
## DAISY RAISES £70 FOR MS SOCIETY






