A message from The Headteacher

Dear Parents / Carers,

In my last newsletter, I wished outgoing Year 11 well, as they ended their time at Lakelands and headed off to enjoy the long, hot summer. I'm delighted to report that they achieved excellent results, individually, and overall as a year group. You may have heard of the government's new, key progress measure, Progress 8, whereby every school or academy is given a headline figure. Lakelands' Progress 8 figure for 2018 showed massive improvement on the 2017 figure, and on Results Day it was a joy to see students' faces as they held in their hands the concrete proof that their hard work had been worth it.

I'm writing this on my way back from London, following a very productive meeting at Westminster with local MP Owen Paterson, and Education Minister Nick Gibb. A representative group of North Shropshire headteachers travelled down together to lobby for ministers to appreciate the challenges which are facing rural schools in Shropshire. Though we are all fiercely proud of our individual schools, I think that it's hugely encouraging that we are committed to working together to support education in our beautiful part of the shire.

As a representative of 'Team Lakelands', I wore my four house badges with pride in Parliament, and was particularly pleased to be asked to explain their significance. It's nice to think that our rewards system is being discussed far and wide! The final week of every half term is Rewards Assembly week, and I don't think there is anybody here who isn't desperate to know which of Blakemere, Colemere, Newtonmere and Whitemere has gathered most tokens in their house 'tube'. Every token tells a story - of hard work, determination, resilience or persistence, and it's only fitting that we should set aside time to celebrate the achievements of the first half term.

I want to thank Mr Parkhurst, Miss Mansfield and Mrs Cartwright for making sure that the recent year 6 'taster day' was a huge success. We had more youngsters spending the day with us than for quite a number of years, and it was wonderful to see them leaving - some clutching pizza that they had

made, all chattering excitedly about the new friends they had met. Days like these take a huge amount of organisation, but are so rewarding for all involved. I must give a special mention to the Year 10 pupils who stepped up to act as prefects for the day, and who stayed with Year 6 all day. By the end of the day they were exhausted and some reported that they had new respect for the pace at which staff have to work!

Year 11 prefects provided invaluable support during our Open Day in September, and were brilliant ambassadors for Lakelands. Many lovely comments were made about their obvious pride in their school, and their informative and entertaining tours round the academy were a great success.

Year 11 also supported us on Presentation evening, enjoying a break from the routine of homework and mock exam preparation. This year we were lucky enough to have BBC News presenter Frankie Macamley as our guest speaker. It was a particular joy to see one of 'our own' - a former Lakelands student- back to share with us the story of how her career path led her to become a regular face on BBC news. Of course, it was her role to present the awards, but we did manage to surprise her with a Newtonmere badge, so she didn't leave empty handed!

None of us can escape the march of time, and Year 11 are due to sit their GCSE mock exams quite soon (they begin on December 3rd.) I cannot over emphasise how valuable these exams are. They are preparation for the 'real thing', a way to diagnose where extra focus needs to be given, and, potentially, a much needed confidence boost to draw on over the next six months. I urge Year 11 to use the mocks to their best advantage and remind them that with the revised GCSEs, nobody can leave revision until the summer and still hope to succeed. Rest assured, we will support Year 11 as much as we can – and in the seeming blink of an eye, the mocks will be over and Christmas will be here.

There was a fantastic turnout for this year's *Lakelands Academy Presentation Evening* in October. This celebratory evening is hosted annually, to present Year 11 leavers with their GCSE certificates and a number of other shields, trophies and awards for various achievements during their time at Lakelands.

This year's guest speaker was former student Frankie McCamley who attended Lakelands School between 1999 – 2004. After pondering what to do after leaving and completing her education to post graduate level, Frankie set her sights on journalism. She went on to work for BBC Radio Shropshire, BBC WM Radio and then headed for the media metropolis of London. Frankie is now a BBC News TV reporter and presents all over the world, focussing on hard news like terror attacks, crime and the Grenfell Tower tragedy

Lakelands Street Dance World Champion



Lakelands student Scott Hoskisson has once again fast, slow and street danced his way to become a British Champion. As part of a team of 12, they have taken the title of Intermediate Fast World Champions at the British Championships held at the Blackpool Winter Gardens in October.

Year 9 student, Scott was entered into the 4 competitions, 2 solo, 1 as part of a duo and 1 as part of 12 dancers for Team BC, by the Border Counties School for Dance based at St Martins School. They were up against many other dance teams from around Great Britain and competed in a number of events, with repeated dance routines ranging from 30 seconds to 4 minutes.

Scott said "We have been training for this event for the last few months and it was really good to win."

Lakelands Student helps support Kelda Wood in her *Row to Raise*, Solo Row across the Atlantic Ocean to raise funds for *Climbing Out*

Over the Summer holidays, Lakelands Students Rosie Milford with her Grandfather, have been helping to outfit the *Storm Petrol*, an ocean going rowing boat, for Kelda Wood, who is attempting in December, to become the first adaptive person to solo row the Atlantic in the 3000 mile, annual, Talisker Atlantic Challenge race, rowing around the equator from Tenerife to Antiqua.

Kelda Wood is taking on this challenge to raise hope in young people facing physical or mental trauma, raise awareness and also to raise funds and support the charity *Climbing Out* which runs activity programmes aimed at rebuilding confidence and self esteem in young people aged 16-30yrs who've been through a life changing injury, illness or trauma. *Climbing Out* a charity based in Westbury near Shrewsbury, was founded by Kelda in 2010 after she suffered a serious leg injury that had a huge impact on her own life. Kelda has gone on to represent Great Britain as a member of the GB Paracanoe squad, however, having just missed out on selection for the Paralympic Games in Rio, she was then selected as a member of the Adaptive Grand Slam Team who were attempting to climb Aconcagua, the highest peak in South America at 7,000m. On the 19th January 2017, she became the first recorded adaptive female to summit the mountain.

This is not the first time Storm Petrol has completed this journey. The boat has been lent to Kelda by Mike Brendan, who successfully completed the Talisker Whiskey Atlantic Challenge in 2015. They have been ensuring the boat is now compliant with the current Talisker Whiskey Atlantic Challenge race rules and adapting things like foot straps and cords to limit seat movement, for Kelda's needs.

Rosie also had time to interview Kelda about some of the things involved in this challenge.

How long does it take to row the Atlantic?

The race will take about 2-3 months. We start on 12th December, so I'll be gone for Christmas. It depends on the weather and wind.

Why is it done in the winter?

The race is run at this time as it's the end of the hurricane season and the trade winds are going in the right direction which is really helpful for the rowers.

Why are you doing it?

I want to raise awareness about mental and physical trauma in young people. I really like a challenge. There are lots of boats entering the race. Some are team boats or pairs but I am entering as a solo competitor, I'll be on my own for the whole race. I am going to be rowing for a different person each day and telling their stories. You can follow these at rowtoraise.com.

What training have you done to do this?

Physically I have been training in a gym at least 6 days a week and rowing on the sea as much as I can but not as much as I'd like because its quite hard getting the boat in and out of the water. Mentally I am already quite prepared as I've always enjoyed challenges like this and have done lots of other expeditions.

What food are you taking?

A lot of it will be dehydrated foods, like ration packs but also foods I really like such as honey roast peanuts and wine gums. I have to take everything with me from the start. There are no pit stops or top ups from anywhere. I need to eat about 6000 calories a day, which is a lot of food!

How do you sleep?

My plan is to sleep from 12 -5am each day but this is just a plan. This will depend on list of things like how tired I get and weather etc. But, while I'm asleep I am not moving toward the finish and the boat will be drifting so I may just end up sleeping an hour here or there. I'm trying to stay open minded about this.

How do you go to the loo?

It's a bucket and chuck it. I will be safety clipped to the boat at all times and it's not safe to just hang over the side so I need the bucket. I have had to practice using this on my practice rows and it's not easy.

How will you know where you are going?

I have a chart plotter satellite system a bit like a SATNAV. I also have a compass fitted in my rowing line of site so I can follow a bearing.

How are you not going to be lonely?

I think I will be. I don't mind being on my own but I'll really miss my dogs. I have a SAT phone but I think I will try not to use it as it will make me feel more lonely. Loneliness may also be an incentive to row faster and get back home.

What treats are you taking?

Chocolate, yoghurt raisins and yoghurt bananas. I'm really looking forward to sitting in the evening and watching the incredible sunsets possibly with a bit of red wine.



What do you think you will miss the most?

My dogs and walking. I'm not going to be able to walk more than 2 step at any time.

The 34 students chosen from their Cooper test results or volunteered from Mrs Whitley's Cross Country club (Fridays 3.30 – 4.30pm), all ran with great determination and passion and some fantastic team and personal results were achieved.

In the team results the Year 8 Boys team came in 3rd place, the Year 9 Girls team came 2nd and Year 10/11 placed 3rd in the competition. 3 Lakelands students also placed individually in the top 6 for their races; Year 8, Tom Upton came in 3rd, Lucy Othen came in 1st place and Year 9 Clover Porritt came in 5th.

"It was great to see the majority of North Shropshire schools competing. Cross country can be a very challenging event particularly in terms of weather but we were lucky with the weather and all students competed valiantly with a smile." Commented Mollie Croxon, North Shropshire School Games Organiser. "Good luck to all students competing at the School games County Finals in November."

These students now progress onto the School Games Cross Country County Final Secondary Mini Festival at Shrewsbury Sports Village on 15th November, where they will represent North Shropshire and compete against the other 5 areas from Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin; Shrewsbury, East Shropshire, South Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin Burton Borough, and Telford and Wrekin Langley.






