A message from The Headteacher

This academic year saw us all hoping that we were going to have a year of normality and uninterrupted learning. Sadly, Covid decided otherwise, despite our efforts with handwashing, sanitising and now, once again, masks.

Like most schools in Shropshire, we found ourselves watching the alarming numbers of positive cases, and realised that, despite our optimism, we are most definitely not out of the woods yet as a nation. Nonetheless, the changing government guidance for September has allowed some aspects of our pre-Covid life to return. It's lovely to see our youngsters allowed to play football again at break and lunchtimes (I think this was the hardest of all the restrictions they faced last year to explain to them!) and to see clubs and activities getting going again. We also had our first school council meeting of the year recently, and it was great to see this forum for student voice in action again. Form representatives take their role very seriously, and spoke eloquently about issues ranging from safeguarding, to school lunches, to site maintenance, showing a real desire to make Lakelands as good as it can be for everybody.

I'm also delighted to see year group assemblies back on the timetable. Last year most were held remotely, with staff recording them for form tutors to show in class. There was nothing wrong with these (in fact, some were extremely creative) but we are a **community**, and being together at key moments is really important to our family ethos.

The new education secretary has indicated that exams will be going ahead in summer 2022 for Year 11 students. I think there is a general feeling in education that we will see exams back again for this cohort. Because of the disruption students have experienced already, there will be modifications to some subjects for 2022, though not to all. Staff are working incredibly hard to make sure that our students have the very best opportunity to succeed, and to make sure that they can achieve to their fullest potential next year. Our Year 11s are understandably anxious, but they are in very safe and experienced hands.

This term we have introduced **DEAR** time, on a rolling programme through the fortnight, for years 7 and 8. **DEAR** stands for 'Drop Everything and Read' and it is twenty minutes where everybody – including the teacher – focuses on a reading book. Research shows that this will be an excellent investment of time. Literacy is vital for student success in all subjects, because if pupils can't understand what they are being asked to do in exam questions, they may have incredible scientific, mathematical or technical subject knowledge, but they won't know what they have to do to show it off. As Dr Seuss said: "The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go."

On a far more sombre note, this term we have been responding to the report published in the summer by the DfE report on 'Sexual violence and sexual harassment between children in schools and colleges.' One of the saddest aspects of the report was that far too many young people across the UK were recorded as saying that they thought that they had to put up with inappropriate things being said to them, or peers invading their personal space uninvited. I've made it very clear in assemblies that such behaviours will not be tolerated, and that the only way that we can create a society with boundaries and respect, is by challenging things that may have seemed acceptable decades ago, but certainly aren't in 2021.

Today I was reminded (as if I could ever forget) that we have incredible young people in this school, who look beyond their own issues and priorities, and work as a team to support others. At breaktime, an impressive queue snaked out of the hall and through reception, as the classic Lakelands cake sale made its comeback. This one was organised by our Year 11 prefects who were raising funds for Macmillan Cancer support. If ever there was a good excuse for eating cake, this was it!

Have a lovely half term, wherever you are and whatever you are doing. Not long now to Christmas!

We are very excited about AR and can't wait to get it up and running in school- watch this space! Reading, as you know, is so important and any extra encouragement to get children to read at home as well as school is always really appreciated!

Our Half Term Hero awards are due to be given out this week too! Look out for a certificate coming home or through the post, and well done to last term's winners!

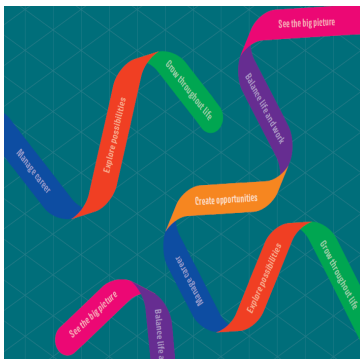

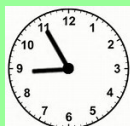
REPORTING AN ABSENCE

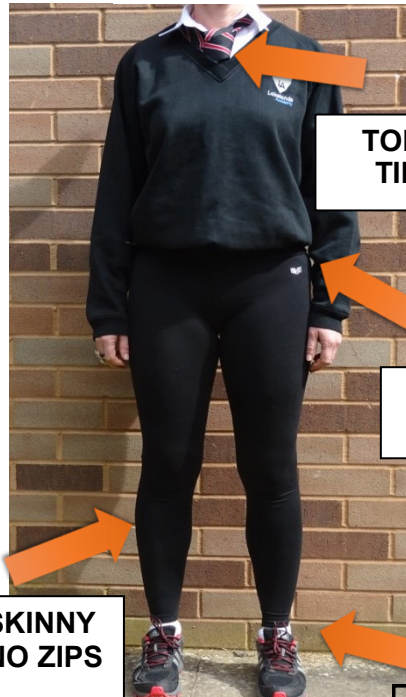

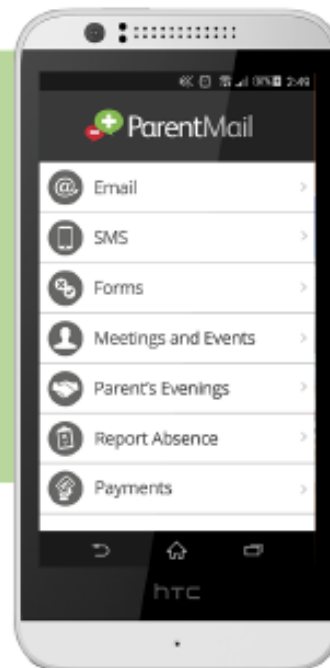
