Highlights have included participation in charity fundraising for organisations such as Children in Need, Young Minds, Brain Tumour Research, Royal British Legion and Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Hospital, alongside community **lifestyle Newsletter** projects including work with the Memory Café and the Teams4U Shoebox Appeal.

Sporting participation has been another major success, with students representing the academy in football, netball, rugby, athletics and many other activities. We have celebrated numerous individual and team achievements at local, county and national level, while our inter-house competitions have continued to build teamwork, resilience and school spirit. In recognition of our outstanding commitment to developing physical education, increasing student participation, and hosting competitive sports, I am delighted to announce that we have recently been awarded the national School Games Gold Award.

Educational visits and enrichment opportunities have further enhanced learning, with trips to venues such as Cadbury World, Shrewsbury Prison and Lilleshall National Sports Centre, alongside careers events, guest speakers and workshops that have helped students broaden their horizons and prepare for their futures.

This year has also seen significant achievements for the school itself.

Lakelands Academy has been recognised with national attendance awards, including ranking among the top 25% of schools nationally for attendance and consistently having the

highest attendance of all secondary schools in Shropshire. We have also recently been awarded the Bronze 'Inclusive Attendance' accreditation.

These achievements reflect the commitment of our students, staff and families working together to ensure success.

Our last few weeks of the academic year has seen lots of activity and opportunity for our children. From Sports Day and football tournaments, to reward trips and Prom, from Summer Festival to transition day, and

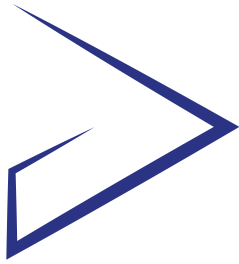

Sporting Opportunities Across the Year

Lakelands students have embraced an exceptional year of sport — from netball, football, gymnastics and swimming, to leadership qualifications, coaching festivals, padel taster sessions and outstanding performances at Queensway and our own Sports Day. Their enthusiasm, resilience and teamwork have shone throughout every opportunity.



North Shropshire tournaments — Students represented Lakelands brilliantly in multiple netball, rounders and football competitions, demonstrating skill, teamwork and determination.

Gymnastics and swimming — Participation across both Key Stages has continued to grow, with students showing confidence and commitment in individual and team events.

Cricket coaching — A significant number of students in KS3 and KS4 benefited from six weeks of specialist coaching earlier this year, developing technique, game awareness and a love for the sport.

Lilleshall National Sports Centre — An opportunity for our Year 7 girls to experience taster sessions in boxing, netball, cricket, archery and squash, building confidence and self-belief through sport.

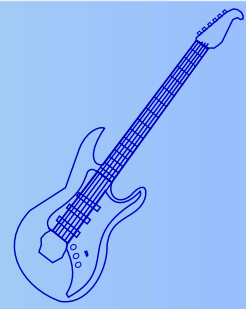
Kettlemere Centre Summer School

Please copy the link and paste into your browser. · You will receive an email confirmation when your order is ready to be collected.
- Orders can be collected from reception by the Parent or the pupil. We ask that orders are collected as soon as possible and will only be held for 5 days.
- If the item is not in stock you will be added to a waiting list and contacted as soon as it becomes available.

If your child is absent for more than one day, please note that we require you to phone **every morning**, not just on the first day of absence.
